DELICIOUS pizza you can eat without any quilt - on a scale of great Scottish inventions, it's right up there with Penicillin and Tarmac.

For Donnie Maclean and Katie Sillars of Glasgow's nutritious pizza firm Eat Balanced, it's already proving a money-spinner in local branches of supermarkets Asda and Sainsbury's, and made them the stars of this week's BBC2 documentary The Entrepreneurs.

Finnieston-based Eat Balanced, selected in February as one of the Evening Times Local Business Accelerator prize-winners, is now preparing to establish its uniquely nutritious pizzas across the UK, after taking advice from our top team of business mentors, Les Meikle, of Wise Property, Laura Gordon, of Corporate Connections, and former Microsoft Scotland boss Raymond O'Hare.

As part of the scheme, the winners also received free ad campaigns using the Times' talented creative team and product promotions to help boost their firm.



Donnie said: "Since we started trading last September we've sold 16,000 pizzas just in Scotland, and had great feedback from the stores. Now we're ready to launch in London, and have a listing on online store Ocado.

"We're making good progress with other retailers and are going to be approaching premium retailers like Harrods food hall with our new top of the range venison pepperoni pizza."
